HOW TO USE GOSPEL JOURNEY MAUI

GOSPEL Journey Maui is a nine week DVD-based reality series curriculum. This resource is designed to help students understand the message of the gospel, and learn how to engage others in spiritual conversation. In each episode. The Stier and Zane Black model the process of spiritual dialogue, giving believers a real-life glimpse into how to relationally share the gospel. Christian of dents will grow deeper in their relationship with God as they wrestle threugh their own theological understanding of their faith by watching Greg and Zane answer some of life's greatest questions straight from the pages of the Bible.

In addition to modeling effective evangelism, the reality series is also an outreach resource. As students pray for and invite their unrealized friends to the series, real-life opportunities to engage nonbelievers in spiritual conversation will unfold.


The curriculum is suitable for mid-week youth group meetings, Sunday morning curriculum, small group meetings of re reat settings. It is designed for a 60-75 minute timeslot, but easily expands if time allows. The longer your timeslot, the more deeply your students will be able to engage with the content.

To help you customize the materials to best fit your group, you'll find both a PDF and an editable Work format version of this Leader's Guide on your Support CD. For your convenience you have permission to make up to ten copies of the *GOSPEL Journey Maui* DVDs, Support CD and Leader's Guide file for use within your church. Preparing to launch the series

- Pray! The spiritual prep work of prayer is a critical starting point as you prepare to launch the *Maui* reality series. Get your teens praying alongside you for the friends they want to invite to the series. Lay a strong spiritual foundation by praying every step along the way!
- Preview. Take an advance look at the first session or two of the DVD and curriculum to get a feel for the material. Previewing the material will allow to effectively and enthusiastically describe the series to your teens, pa and adult leaders. (0,
- Plan. Take the following steps:
 - Determine how many additional copies of the compar you'll need for your group. The student books are an integral part of each week's lesson, so you'll need a copy for each student. Order your copies early, so you have them in hand whe launch the nine week series.
 - rally your student One month before the launch of you leadership team and adult leaders ing them a pre-screening of the promo video.
 - Organize a specific plan for integrating any visitors into the group, including a follow up and discipleship strategy. For help with this, check out the free new parever discipleship videos found at http:// somethingamazing.n oving-forward/.
 - Fill in the when/wh details on the editable invitations found on your Support CD and nnt them out.
- **Promote!** Three weeks out, show the promo video to your youth group and/ or church. Maui is a powerful outreach vehicle which will engage believers and unbelievers alike. Challenge your students to identify 2-3 friends they will pray for and invite to the *Maui* reality series. Provide them with invitations to pass out to their friends. Remind your teens that most people come to a youth group event because of a personal invitation. Print out copies of the locker size posters available on your Support CD and distribute them.
- Pray! One week out, arrange some time for your youth group to pray by name for the friends your students are inviting to the series.



Preparing each week's lesson

As you prepare for each week's lesson, you will want to **grab your Leader's Guide** and a copy of the Student Book.

DISCUSSION-DRIVEN TEACHING STYLE

Both the DVD episodes and the supporting youth group curriculum are student-centric. The goal is to trigger discussion and engage teens, before weaving the conversation back to what the Bible has to say. The lessons will be most effect to if teens' natural curiosity is unleashed and they are pushed to think deeply a out what they believe and why. Once your students engage with the topic at hand, the Leader's Guide moves the discussion from individual opinion to appacking God's Word and exploring what the Scripture has to say about the issue under discussion. The goal is to move your students from observers to participants.

FREEDOM AND FLEXIBILITY

Because discussion can vary greatly from group to group and session to session, you are encouraged to gauge your own group's needs and pick and choose the discussion questions which are most relevanter your needs. Know that if your teens engage with you during the session in deep discussion, it's highly likely you will not have time to cover all the discussion questions provided and that's OK. Stay flexible and feel free to customize the materials to fit your group's needs and timeframe.

LESSON COMPONENTS

Each Leader's Guide lesson is cludes the following sections:

- PACK YOUR COOLER. A is of supplies is identified for each lesson.
- CATCH THE WAVE An cebreaker activity and a few opening questions are provided to help your students engage with the DVD material they are about to watch. After a brief discussion time, you will launch into the DVD viewing portion of your lesson. Following the video, there are additional discussion questions designed to help the students begin personally processing through the topic of the lesson. When you are asking questions, don't be intimidated if you are met with silence. Wait patiently for a response—uncomfortable silence is your friend. Remember that Jesus was the master at uncomfortable moments. Sooner or later, someone will start talking.
- **DIVE DEEP:** This section provides the meat of the teaching portion of the lesson. You will dive deeper into Scripture, providing a Biblical perspective on the key question being addressed in the session.
- **SAIL HOME:** This is the personal application section. It will challenge your students to be doers and not hears only and to apply what they've learned to their personal lives.



- **ALOHA:** This section will wrap-up your session, and provide you a natural transition each week to clearly present the gospel and invite students to put their trust in Christ or recommit their lives.
- **BACKGROUND/RESOURCES:** The Leader's Guide provides a short list of where to turn for more information on each session's topic if you or your students want to dig deeper.
- **PARENT NEWSLETTER AND ACTIVITIES:** We strongly believe in involving parents in the *Maui* series by using the weekly newsletter updates which summarize what's coming up and provide parent/teen activity ideas and discussion questions. You can find these in the Parent Letter folder on your Support CD.

Using the bonus extras on your DVD

Check out the bonus extras on your DVD, and use them to promote voluntality series or to supplement the 9 week series and trigger further discussion

Customize your reality series!

You understand your group better than anyone, and know what will (and won't) work. As you prepare each lesson, consider what your students are like, and how the time can be most meaningful for everyone. Use the directions and questions in this Leader's Guide as much or as little as you'd like. Treat it as a springboard to a more tailored experience. Above all, be flexible and willing to adjust to whatever's going on (in mid-sentence, it necessary) and recognize that if your discussion times go deep, it is histay likely you will not have time to cover all the questions provided. Each session is intended for students to make their own discoveries and spiritual extra ations, guided by the truth of God's Word.

If your group is large, desider dividing your students into smaller groups of 7-8 for the discussion sections of the lesson. You can either have an adult volunteer sit with each group, or you can walk among the groups as the discussions flow, asking each question loudly enough for everyone to hear.

Follow the Holy Spirit's leading throughout, and be sensitive to how vastly different teenagers are—mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Some may have been Christians most of their lives, others may have never heard of Jesus, and many may be somewhere in between. Avoid "insider" lingo or Christian catchphrases, which can be intimidating. Guide the discussion in a way that encourages honesty (without embarrassment) and dives below the surface.



PRAY

Settle your students and offer a brief opening prayer. Thank God for bringing each of you here; ask God to help create connections and friendships, bringing you closer to Him and each other.

EXPLAIN

Sometimes the bigness of things can be mind-bending, can't it? But when you think about it, there is also a different kind of "big" that has little to do with the physical dimensions of an object. This other kind of "big" has more to do with something being extremely important and highly impacting. And that's what our new series we're kicking off today called *GOSPEL Journey Maui* is about—the big, important, impacting questions of life.

Now many of you may be thinking that I'm talking about questions like

- Should I go to college and if so, where?
- Who should I date?
- What kind of job do I want?
- What will really make me happy?

All of these are seriously big, important questions of key impact your present and your future. But there are actually some even bigger questions looming out there for you to explore—questions that will dry the very foundation for how you answer all the other questions life will throw your way. These very biggest questions are pivotal to what you will become, and how you will approach life.

Questions like...Is there a higher power?

How you eventually decide to answer this question will have a lifelong impact on how you view yourself and the world around you. It's an important question to think about. Seriously.

ASK

- Why do you think this question causes so much fear, controversy, and confusion? Why is finding the answer so tough?

EXPLAIN

Tough questions. Honest talk. Real answers. That's what we're here for. I hope you're prepared for something extraordinary, because we're going to embark on an adventure that'll change lives in this room. Guiding us along this adventure is a fascinating group of students, each with a totally unique background and point-of-view. As we watch this first episode of *GOSPEL Journey Maui*, we'll get to meet the cast and dive into our first big question: Is there a Higher Power?

PLAY

After watching the first episode which cast member do you most identify with and why?

ASK

- Is anyone willing to share with the rest of us who they most related to and why?
- The cast began the day on the top of the volcano. Priscilla said it was how she pictured heaven. And Jasser said that every piece of art has an artist. This is the big question raised by nature's awesome beauty: *How did everything get here?* What do you think?
- We're not standing on a volcano surrounded by ocean right now, but what evidences around us might point to the existence of a divine Creator?

YOUTH LEADER HINT BOX

If these questions spark a bigger conversation about evolution and creation, be ready with a clear but relatively simple exploration of apologetics. To help you, check out Greg Stier's blog entry, *Why I Believe in the God of the Bible*, found at http://www.gregstier.org/rants/why-i-believe-in-the-god-of-the-bible/. Share as much or as little of the article as you'd like, and give students time to weigh in with their reactions.

DIVE DEEP

Greg read an interesting passage from the New Testament. Let's take a closer look at that Scripture to see if we can make some ground on the Structure.
